Why 1 to 1 Laptop Program?

How are schools supported?



What is happening in other schools?











What is a one-to-one program?





One-to-one learning provides every student access to his or her own laptop computer in a wireless environment allowing students to learn at their own pace and ability levels.



 Increases teacher's pedagogical capacity 'Adding tools to the toolkit'



 Transition from occasional, supplemental use to more frequent, meaningful use

What will it look like in the classroom?

- The program will complement the existing school curriculum by <u>providing appropriate digital learning</u> <u>tools in balance</u> with more traditional learning tools.
- The goals of the curriculum are supported, not supplanted, by the use of 1-to-1 devices. Students will use 1-to-1 devices <u>where they serve a purpose</u>.
- The <u>use of the device will vary significantly</u> from day to day dependent upon purpose!
